 - c. Salem Trials gender/class challenges
- 4. Class struggles
 - a. Economic—wealthy v. impoverished v. middle class
 - b. Political—Burgesses v. tidewater farmers
 - c. Religious—laity v. clergy
- 5. European rivalries
 - a. England v. France: (religious, economic, and political)
 - b. England v. Dutch: (East India Company, tea trade; Lutheran v. Calvinist)
 - c. England v. Spain: (religion, old hatreds—Spanish Armada, Henry VIII, economic competition)
